





CATARACT LENS IMPLANT OPTIONS

Please discuss the following lens types and surgical options with your doctor to determine which is the best fit for both your lifestyle and vision needs.

<p>Intraocular Lens Implant</p> 	<p>Standard Monofocal Lens Implant</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides only distance vision • Does not reduce astigmatism • Will still need glasses for all near and mid-vision activities and may need glasses for distance • Insurance usually covers 80% of the surgery, including this standard lens
 <p>Toric IOL</p>	<p>Toric Lens Implant</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Specifically designed for patients with moderate or severe astigmatism • Can reduce or eliminate the effects of astigmatism and significantly improve uncorrected distance vision • Most patients will still need glasses for all near and mid-vision activities
 <p>Lifestyle Lens</p>	<p>Lifestyle Lens Implant</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Designed to provide patients with improved vision for distance, intermediate and near • May still need glasses for some activities • There are also Toric versions for patients with significant astigmatism
 <p>Light Adjustable Lens</p>	<p>Light Adjustable Lens (LAL)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Will be adjusted AFTER cataract surgery • Corrects for mild to moderate astigmatism • Used for distance vision and can be customized to adjust for intermediate and near vision in many cases
