




## CATARACT SURGICAL OPTIONS

*Please discuss the following lens types and surgical options with your doctor to determine which is the best fit for both your lifestyle and vision needs.*

 <p><b>Phaco Machine</b></p>	<p><b>Traditional Cataract Surgery</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Usually used with a monofocal lens and does not correct for astigmatism</li> <li>• May need glasses for distance</li> <li>• Will need glasses for intermediate and near tasks</li> <li>• Usually covered by your insurance (depending on copays and coverage)</li> </ul>
 <p><b>Laser For Cataract Surgery</b></p>	<p><b>Laser Assisted Custom Cataract Surgery</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provides laser precision to correct mild to moderate astigmatism</li> <li>• Can be used with monofocal lenses to reduce astigmatism and improve uncorrected distance vision</li> <li>• May be used in conjunction with Lifestyle or Toric lenses to enhance outcomes and reduce astigmatism</li> </ul>
 <p><b>Light Delivery Device</b></p>	<p><b>Light Delivery Device (LDD)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Used to customize and adjust the Light adjustable lens <b>AFTER</b> cataract surgery</li> <li>• Allows you to preview your vision before the final outcome</li> </ul>
